## June Supply List

Hello everyone! Welcome to our updated supply list for June. If you've gathered supplies for a previous month or for the year, you'll notice that many of these supplies will already be listed on your general supply list... but some of them won't. As you know, I support you doing your own thing as well! Don't be afraid to try new techniques and products but also try to use up your own stash when you can. Part of the fun is seeing your own take on each project or layout.

### Supplies Needed for June:

At Big Picture Scrapbooking, substitutions are encouraged! Our supply lists are designed to help you use what you have on hand. When you do need help or additional supplies, we believe the personal attention at your local scrapbook store can't be beat. ### STACY'S BASICS

- paper trimmer
- precision-tipped scissors
- paper-to-paper adhesive (glue stick)
- photo adhesive (tape runner)
- black journaling pens (in sizes .03 and .08)
- pencil
- art gum eraser
- see-through ruler
- paper piercer
- craft knife

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## Week 1 Project:

- circle album of your choice - between 5" - 6" diameter (I used a round CD case - **Swing Solo** brand where the CD pages became sheet protectors. A chipboard album would also work. You can also use an album that is not a circle - the templates I designed are in a circle shape but can be used on a square or rectangle page as well.)
- **Other options:** **Tinkering Ink**, **Rusty Pickle**
- white cardstock or one sheet of various colors for page backgrounds - you will have a choice.
- **white cardstock** for printing and painting on.
- acrylic paint - one color per page of your album (optional - I used paint on white cardstock for each page but you can also use different colored cardstock instead of paint).
- make-up sponges for painting or foam paint brushes.
- ten to twenty small brads.
- about 1" high stickers, chipboard or other letters to spell "COLOR."
- about 1" high sticker, chipboard or other letter "C" (optional).
- one or two small embellishments of your choice such as a shaped brad or chipboard shape. (I used a star brad on one version and a star chipboard shape plus a Tim Holtz game spinner on the other version of the album).
- circle cutter (I use the Creative Memories Circle Cutter system but you can use your chipboard album as a template or even a kitchen bowl and craft knife to cut circles the same size as your album pages).
- journaling pen.
- journaling and title templates downloaded from classroom
- color page templates of your choice downloaded from the classroom
- 2" x 3" photos for each page or color in your album - wallet size (you will also have the option of using other size photos such as 4" x 6" but this will be explained in June).



## Week 3 "Life Tunes" Layout:

**Note:** Check the classroom for Pre-Workshop instructions for preparing the cover and title page of your 9" x 9" BoBunny Chipboard Bare Naked Binder. We have created new layouts January through May with a new layout in June. If you are just joining us, start where you are - each monthly layout stands alone.

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- 9" x 9" BoBunny Bare Naked Binder Chipboard pages: if you have done any of this album, you should already have these. We will use the back of May's 5"-wide page and a 9" x 9" tabbed chipboard page for this month. You may substitute other materials if you wish, of course.
- cardstock sheets for backgrounds on each page (one sheet will be printed on).
- white cardstock sheet for printing template.
- 1" x 1" squares of various colors of cardstock.
- three to six small embellishments of your choice - smaller than 1" (I used two Heidi Swapp mini chipboard shapes, a spiral paper clip, a small flower, a button and string, a decorative brad and a small metal letter - all were in my stash).
- craft knife and cutting mat (optional).
- ruler.
- 1/4" hole punch.
- sandpaper (optional).
- journaling pen.
- ink pad for inking edges (optional).
- pop dot adhesive (optional).
- corner rounder (optional).
- template downloaded from classroom
- one to five photos of yourself - all 1"x1" in size.
